## **Verifying your suppliers**

You will need to verify the certification documents of your suppliers to ensure they a) identify your supplier,

- b) cover the type or range of products you are purchasing,
- c) are valid at the time you are making the purchase,
- d) clearly reference that the ingredient is certified to organic Food & Drink standards.

You must make a record of these checks. The system you have in place to verify the certification documents of your suppliers and record these checks will be verified at inspection.

This guide will show you how to verify the certification documents of your suppliers yourself.

# Understanding the difference between GB Organic Standards and Soil Association Organic Standards

Soil Association certifies businesses to two separate standards, you will need to know to which standard your product can be certified to, and which suppliers have equivalent organic standards.

- The GB organic standards as laid out in retained regulation 834/2007 θ
   889/2008 are the baseline organic standards all organic products must meet in GB.
- <u>Soil Association higher organic standards</u>. This certification means the product has met both the baseline GB requirements and the additional requirements or 'higher standards' set out in the Soil Association standards.

Soil Association has higher organic standards in relation to:

- Meat, animal and fish products including poultry and eggs
- Ingredients from endangered species
- Palm Oil
- GMO's
- Packaging materials
- Wine
- Use of additives, flavourings, processing aids

If you wish for your product to be certified to Soil Association higher standards and carry the Soil Association symbol, and your product contains any of the ingredients listed in the <u>Sourcing Organic Ingredients Annex</u> please submit the supplier certificates

## Checking organic certificates and control bodies

#### Bio C - BIO C

This website is a register of organic businesses from countries around the world, you can use the search function within Bio C to check the validity of an organic certificate by searching the business name, postcode and country. Please note this is not an exhaustive list and does not include all organic businesses or countries and the search function can be sensitive so ensure you use correct capital letters, spacing and spellings.

#### Organic register of approved UK control bodies - UK approved Control Bodies

This is a government website listing all the **organic certification bodies within the UK**. You can check your supplier is certified by an approved UK certification body using this website.

#### **OFIS - Control Bodies from Member States**

This page allows you to check the **control bodies** which are registered with the EC for **organic certification within the EU**. You can search by the certification code found on the supplier certificate or by country or city.

The EU has a <u>website</u> where you can check certification of companies within the EU and EEA countries.

## **Annex III) Recognised Non-UK countries and territories -** <u>Organic Register of Equivalent Countries</u>

This list provides details of countries or territories outside the UK that can certify organic food for import into Great Britain.

#### The list shows:

- categories of food that you can import from each country or territory.
- any restrictions that apply for each product category these are listed under 'Limitations' and 'Notes'.
- Names, code numbers and websites of the control bodies and authorities that can certify food for import from each country or territory.


#### The list shows:



# **Section 3: Third country suppliers (Outside GB and EU)**

- Non-UK control bodies/ certifiers recognised as having equivalent organic standards to GB, who operate in countries which do not have equivalent organic standards, as listed in the online government register recognised Non-UK control bodies and authorities annex IV.



#### How to use annex III

This annex lists countries and territories which have been recognised by DEFRA as having equivalent organic standards to GB.

- 1. Is the supplier certified in a country listed in annex III (Recognised non- UK countries and territories?) \*Check the 'Table of contents' page to see if the country is listed. Then, go to the corresponding numbered tab.
- 2. Does the supplier certificate show the name of a certifying body that is listed in annex III under the numbered tab for that country/area?
- 3. If the supplier certificate shows a certification code, does this correspond to the code in annex III? (as listed under the country/area's numbered tab, next to the corresponding certification/control body)? \*Please note, not all certificates will show the certification code.
- 4. Is the category of product you intend to buy listed as 'recognised' for that country? \*At the top of each numbered tab for the country/area, the recognised categories for that country/area are listed, e.g., A,B,C,D,E,F. For definitions of each category, go to the 'Cover\_sheet'.
- 5. If the certificate has an expiry date, is the certificate in date at the point of purchase? \*Certificates from some countries do not have expiry dates e.g., Japan and United States.
- 6. Does the trading schedule/annex list the ingredient/product/product category (s) which you intend to buy?

### How to use annex IV

<u>This annex</u> lists **control bodies** which operate in third countries and have been recognised by DEFRA as having equivalent organic standards to GB.

- 1. Is the supplier certified by a certification/control body listed in annex IV (<u>Recognised non- UK control bodies and control authorities</u>?) \*CTRL+F to search for the certification/control body on the 'Control bodies' tab.
- 2. Is the country of the supplier listed under that certification/control body in annex IV? \*Go to the 'codes' tab and find the certification/control body in question. Then check that the supplier's country is listed underneath.
- 3. If the organic certificate displays a certification code, does this match the code listed in annex IV under the 'codes' tab. Check the code is listed under the correct certifying body and next to the correct corresponding country? \*CTRL+F to search for the code straight away.
- 4. Is the category of product you intend to buy listed as 'recognised' for that certification body in that country? Details of the categories are listed on the 'cover sheet'.
- 5. If the certificate has an expiry date, is the certificate in date at the point of purchase? \*Certificates from some countries do not have expiry dates e.g., Japan and United States.
